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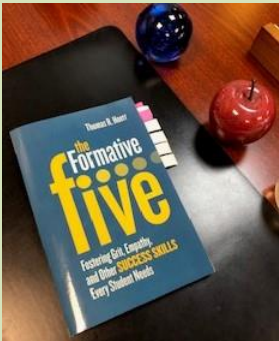


Curriculum Talk

The Green Township School District teachers and administrators are involved in a school-wide book study of Thomas Hoerr’s The Formative Five: Fostering Grit, Empathy, and Other Success Skills Every Student Needs. This shared reading experience allows us to have conversations about what the text means to us and how we can encourage and plan for the teaching of the “success skills” including empathy, self-control, integrity, embracing diversity and grit. The practice of shared reading is part of our District Professional Development Plan for 2019-2020.

Kindergarten studied pumpkins in science, read about them in ILA, did some math activities pumpkin related, read 5 Little Pumpkins, and we did a very cool STEM activity. Kindergarten students created a gate to fit 5 little pumpkins on. Check out our variety of gates. Students worked together in self-selected groups building a gate for their pumpkins. We had quite the variety of gates and enjoyed the success of each other’s STEM groups!

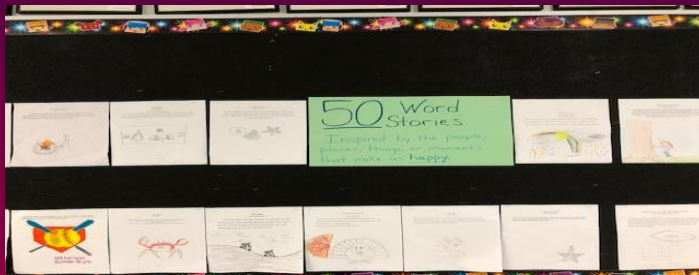


GHS Halloween Parade:

T-Pass System

Green Hills School has installed a new T-Pass school visitor identification system to add to the cadre of tools in place regarding school security. The system, which will be gradually introduced to our school community shortly, will be fully implemented by December 1, 2019. The system requires a visitor to scan their driver's license in order to be allowed entry into the school building. From this scan, a one-time use visitor's badge will be issued. More detailed information will be sent to parents and families in the near future. We appreciate your continued assistance and support with this initiative.
