## GHS PHYSICAL EDUCATION PROVIDES STUDENTS WITH SELF-MONITORING STRATEGIES – MS. RONSINI & MR. SCOTT

The health and physical education department, here at Green Hills School, finds it beneficial and empowering to guide and enable the students to take charge of their behaviors and emotions. We have established a few areas in the gymnasium that allow the students to do just that.

**The Conflict Corner:** When two students have a disagreement, they are able and encouraged to head over to the Conflict Corner to resolve the issue at hand. There are steps to follow that allow open communication in a calm and respectful way. Once both sides have stated their concerns, they brainstorm a solution together. The trip ends with a compliment and a good old-fashioned handshake.

**The Self-Assessment Wall:** This area of the gymnasium is set up to increase self-awareness on a daily basis. On the way in, they can tap the emoji that corresponds to how they are feeling or how their day is going. This gives them a chance to get in touch with their emotions and allows Mr. Scott and Ms. Ronsini to get a feel for how their students are doing. The hope is that, on the way out of class, their emotions may be changed for the better after their brains released some of those “good feeling” endorphins after physical exercise.

**The Caught Ya Corner:** If you get “caught” doing something good, kind, or helpful, you will be sent to the Caught Ya Corner to bang the bucket! The class will pause their activity and cheer for you! We love recognizing good deeds and kind hearts!

It is our goal to make the student’s health and physical education classes as positive, empowering, and inclusive as possible. We have noticed the climate of the PE classes has significantly improved since the addition of these areas!

## PUBLISHED AUTHORS – MS. FRANCIOSI

At the end of last school year, Mrs. Franciosi’s fifth-graders entered a creative writing contest sponsored by Young Writers. The contest, “Crazy Creatures,” challenged them to create a crazy creature and write a mini-saga inspired by their creation. The students went wild with this task and came up with some of the most unique critters that you could imagine.

First, students had to dream up a new species and draw it on their original entry form in full color. Next, they had to create a whole story from beginning to end with only 100 words or less. This was not easy, but they put their brains to work, chose very succinct language, and created wonderful adventures for all to read! Finally, they checked to make sure that they met all of the criteria and then sent them out before the deadline.

Some of these talented writers are now published authors! Their stories can be found in an anthology called *Crazy Creatures; New Jersey Stories*. It is a fantastic collection of wonderful tales of amazing animals and creepy monsters, but the best part of the book can be found on pages 36-54. ## Board of Education Update

[The Green Township

Board of Education voted during its February 19<sup>th</sup> meeting to suspend the search for a new Superintendent, and to petition the Commissioner of Education to allow Interim Superintendent, Dr. Furnari, to remain in Green through December 2021 if needed. The Board intends to resume its search in the future and anticipates a new Superintendent to be in place by July 2021. This decision was made in order to maintain leadership stability during a time when the District is transitioning in other areas, such as those in the Business Office.

The Board also approved a motion in support of Idle Free NJ, a state-wide initiative that encourages drivers to turn off their engines rather than idle in place. Green hills school has endorsed these practices for some time, and the board chose to reiterate its support for the record at their February 19<sup>th</sup> meeting. It is the expectation for all visitors to district property to join us in anti-idling practices. In addition, First Student, the district's transportation vendor, adheres to these requirements and even has special equipment built into their buses to monitor idling practices and to lessen emissions. Please help us make GHS an Idle Free Zone!
