IV. DISCUSSION/ACTION ITEMS

A. Discussion of the Green Township School District 2021-2022 school year calendar draft.

President Bilik asked Dr. Furnari to start the discussion on the school district proposed 2021-2022 calendar. Dr. Furnari stated that she used the Green Township School District 2021-2022 school year calendar and the Sussex County School Calendar for 2021-2022 as the basis for the discussion. A Board member asked if the use of remote learning days could be counted as part of the mandated 180 student days instead of inclement weather days. This would allow the schoolyear to end earlier in June. Dr. Furnari responded that remote learning days only count toward the 180 days due to executive order during the health emergency. Any change to this would require legislative action. Dr. Furnari stated that she discussed the

calendar with Newton Superintendent Greene and Andover Superintendent Tobin, and would follow up with them.

B. Board of Education Ethics Training – Marc Zitomer, attorney for the Green Township Board of Education.

Mr. Zitomer's, power point presentation included examples of the legal responsibilities of being a member of a Board of Education. Mr. Zitomer discussed the ethical response that would assist a board member in dealing with public request for Board information regarding school personnel or how to suggest referring complaints. President Bilik asked Mr. Zitomer for a brief definition of indemnification.

C. Approval of Board of Education Code of Ethics

Be it resolved that the Green Township Board of Education accepts the New Jersey School Boards Association Board Member Code of Ethics as the official Code of Ethics, and further that each Board member has read, understands and shall abide by same. The Board of Education Members had the required Board Ethics Training session as required under N.J.A.C. 6:3-1.3 and N.J.A.C.6A:30.

CODE OF ETHICS

- 1. I will uphold and enforce all laws, state board rules and regulations, and court orders pertaining to schools. Desired changes should be brought about only through legal and ethical procedures.
- 2. I will make decisions in terms of the educational welfare of children and will seek to develop and maintain public schools which meet the individual needs of all children regardless of their ability, race, creed, sex or social standing.
- 3. I will confine my Board action to policy-making, planning, and appraisal, and I will help to frame policies and plans only after the board has consulted those who will be affected by them.
- 4. I will carry out my responsibility, not to administer the schools, but, together with my fellow Board members, to see that they are well run.

- 5. I will recognize that authority rests with the Board of Education and will make no personal promises nor take any private action which may compromise the Board.
- 6. I will refuse to surrender my independent judgment to special interest or partisan, political groups or to use the schools for personal gain or for the gain of friends.
- 7. I will hold confidential all matters pertaining to the schools which, if disclosed, would needlessly injure individuals or the schools. But in all other matters, I will provide accurate information and, in concert with my fellow Board members, interpret to the staff the aspirations of the community for its schools.
- 8. I will vote to appoint the best qualified personnel available after consideration of the recommendation of the chief administrative officer.
- 9. I will support and protect school personnel in proper performance of their duties.
- 10. I will refer all complaints to the chief administrative officer and will act on such complaints at public meetings only after failure of an administrative solution.
